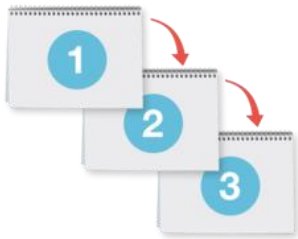

	<p>The London Safeguarding Adult Board (LSAB) want to make sure people who have experience of safeguarding are included in putting safeguarding services together.</p>

	<p>Are you a family member or a carer for someone who has had safeguarding?</p>
	<p>You are committed to helping to make sure adults are treated well and not abused.</p>
	<p>You want to commit to and fully agree, with the work of the LSAB.</p>



	<p>You want to commit to everything being equal, diverse and including everyone.</p>
	<p>You might know how to use IT such as Microsoft Word, Excel, etc.</p>
	<p>However, we can help you to learn if you need help.</p>

	<p>We expect you to attend monthly LSVG meetings. They will last for 90 minutes and take place on Zoom.</p>

	<p>We expect you to attend one meeting each month over Zoom for 90 minutes at a time.</p>
	<p>This is to help LondonADASS and Healthwatch (Kingston and England) deliver a programme of work.</p>



	<p>Will I be supported?</p>
	<p>You will be supported to take part, as well as to enjoy doing so.</p>
	<p>What will I get from taking part?</p>

	<p>Having a say in the Making Safeguarding Personal Regional Agenda.</p>
	<p>Having a say in safeguarding practices across London.</p>
	<p>Developing safeguarding services for the future.</p>
	<p>Making people's safeguarding experience better.</p>







	<p>Training and Supervision:</p>
	<p>Training</p>
	<p>We will give you basic awareness of adult safeguarding training.</p>
	<p>You will need to finish this training within your first three months.</p>



	<p>We will give you a certificate when you finish.</p>
	<p>Expenses</p>
	<p>Because this is volunteering, you will not be paid, but we will pay back the cost of your food and any travel costs.</p>
	<p>Appointment and notice period:</p>



	<p>We want you to join us for two years.</p>
	<p>We will check how well you are doing after 3 months, and again after 6 months.</p>
	<p>We will give you 1 months' notice if we want you to leave us.</p>
	<p>We also want you to give us 1 months' notice if you want to leave us.</p>









	<p>Values and Behaviours of the Group:</p>
	<p><b>Respect:</b> To listen to everyone and value their experiences.</p>
	<p><b>Communication:</b> To speak in a way that gets everyone to join in and take part.</p>
	<p><b>Working Together:</b> To understand and work with each other so that everyone has a good experience.</p>









	<p>Not letting where someone lives affect the safeguarding they get.</p>



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
	<p>Speaking to national work programmes related to safeguarding areas.</p>
